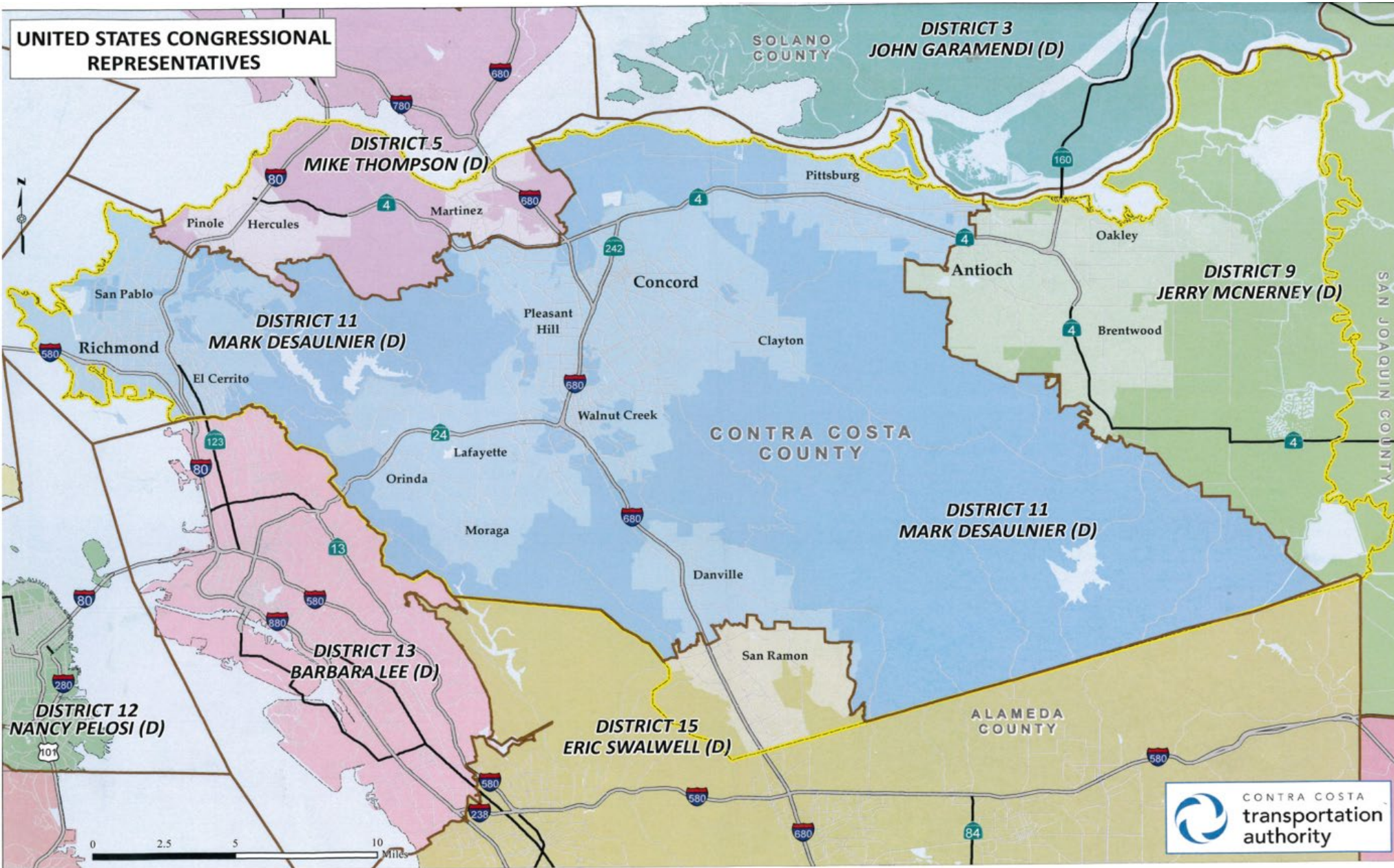

## Defense-Related

- \$3 billion for European Command operations mission support
- \$3.5 billion to replenish U.S. stock of equipment sent to Ukraine

## Non-Defense

- \$1.4 billion in humanitarian support for refugees
- \$2.65 billion for emergency food assistance and health care
- \$22.1 million for economic and trade-based analysis, enforcement, and coordination

# Special Guest: Steven Pifer

Pifer is a William J. Perry Research Fellow at Stanford's Center for International Security and Cooperation and a non-resident senior fellow with the Brookings Institution. Pifer is a former Ambassador to Ukraine.
